

**THE FIVE TYPES OF FACILITIES ALLOWED BY MEDICAL MARIHUANA FACILITIES LICENSING ACT
(MMFLA)**

Grower Facilities

Commercial entity that cultivates, dries, trims, or cures and packages marihuana for sale. Growers (including classes A, B and C): A grower may grow marihuana and sell seeds and plants to another grower or sell plants to a processor or provisioning center. There are three classes of growers:

Class A – 500 marihuana plants

Class B – 1,000 marihuana plants

Class C – 1,500 marihuana plants

Processing Facilities

Commercial entity that purchases marihuana from a grower and extracts the resin or creates a marihuana-infused product for sale in packaged form to a provisioning center.

Safety Compliance Facilities

Commercial entity that receives marihuana from a marihuana facility or registered primary caregiver and tests it for contaminants, THC, and other cannabinoids.

Provisioning Center Facilities

Commercial entity that purchases marihuana from a grower or processor and sells or provides marihuana to registered qualifying patients, directly or through the patients' registered primary caregivers. Before a provisioning center may sell marihuana, it must transport the marihuana to a safety compliance facility for testing and labeling.

Secure Transporter Facilities

Commercial entity that stores marihuana and transports marihuana or money associated with its purchase or sale between marihuana facilities. All movement of marihuana or seeds between other licensees must be done by a secure transporter.
